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Rapid Review

A rapid review speeds up the systematic review process by omitting stages of the systematic review making it less rigorous. Rapid Reviews are best designed for: New or emerging research topics, updates of previous reviews, critical topics, to assess what is already known about a policy or practice using some systematic review methods.

A rapid review (or rapid evidence assessment) is a variation of a systematic review that balances time constraints with considerations in bias.

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However, the time and cost to produce a systematic review is often a barrier to its use in decision-making. Rapid reviews are a timely and affordable approach that can provide actionable and relevant evidence to strengthen health policy and systems.

In circumstances such as these, rapid reviews are recommended by WHO. 8 We undertook a Review of evidence on the psychological impact of quarantine to explore its likely effects on mental health and psychological wellbeing, and the factors that contribute to, or mitigate, these effects. Of 3166 papers found, 24 are included in this Review .

An effective way to synthesize current evidence on a topic is to conduct a rapid review of the literature. Rapid reviews differ from systematic reviews in that the process is tailored for a shorter timeline, but it is still important to use rigorous methodology to ensure that the best available research evidence is used in decision making.
